# Chicken Run

At the start of term 3 we created a new 5\* house for our chickens. Working as a team, the children had to dig out the foundations, construct the flat pack and give it a coat of protective weatherproofing so that it will last a long time.



The bottom of the run was encapsulated with a fine mesh to stop any predators getting in. We back filled the bottom of the run with soil and leaves which will provide the chickens with the correct habitat to exhibit normal behaviour as they can scratch and search for worms and bugs. # Assembly



The assembly held on Friday 26<sup>th</sup> January was dedicated to Holocaust Memorial Day, which took place on Saturday 27<sup>th</sup> January. The theme this year was 'The Fragility of Freedom' and the students all showed fantastic focus as they learnt about what the Holocaust was, who was persecuted and listened to individual accounts. At the end of the session, the students were encouraged to reflect on the Holocaust and consider what can be done to stop such an atrocity occurring again.

## Mercury

Mercury class have been busy yet again and we have been looking at Life Skills in the community and studying Careers. We have been to many local places to develop our independence in the local community.



We have also experienced extracurricular workshops focusing on different careers. We have had the police in to talk about "The life of a Police Officer" and had a hairdresser in to teach hairdressing techniques. This term's Creative Studies topic is "Light" and we conducted many experiments to investigate its properties. The students have shown great engagement and interest in this.







#### Mars

In Mars Class, we have packed a lot into term 3.

Our visitors this term included: the police, the Sky Blue Theatre Company, the Dog's Trust and had Coastal Park School, Folkestone visit for a football match. We were thrilled when we had a special visit from our local police force! The two police officers were here to engage with our students, sharing insights into their work, and provide a firsthand experience of their equipment and vehicles. They discussed the importance of community policing, crime prevention, and the various roles within the police force sharing their personal stories and explaining the rewards of a career in law enforcement.



This was followed by the Sky-Blue Theatre where 'A Midnight Summer's Dream' was the theme of the day. A few pupils took part in a school production of the play before directing and producing their own trailers and photo stills.

Later in the term, Phil from the Dog's trust visited our class and shared his pawsitivity. Sharing a valuable insight and helping the students foster a deeper understanding of what a responsible pet ownership is and the unique bond between humans and their fourlegged friends. We certainly had fun.



Football against Coastal Park School



Through the curriculum we have we have completed James and the Giant Peach in English and moved onto learning about Myths and Legends and we are studying the legend of Romulus and Remus. In mathematics, we have covered multiplication and division. Enhancing their understanding and applying their knowledge to reasoning and problem solving. Moving on we covered perimeter and have begun to learn about fractions.



Our usual Life Skills trips have gone ahead this term with visits to local parks and an Inclusive Sports trip to Hartsdown Sports Centre to take part in a variety of different activities alongside other schools. The class did an amazing job of tackling new tasks such as curling and darts, even taking on another school in a friendly game of bowls.

# Neptune

It has been a short term, but Neptune have really been cramming in a lot. On top of our packed curriculum, we have been studying Shakespeare's 'Midsummer night's dream', and we were fortunate enough to have had the Blue Sky acting workshop come into school. The engaging and comical version of the play and the follow up workshops really consolidated our understanding of the play.





Neptune attended a cricket event hosted by Kent inclusive sport with schools from all over Kent. The event gave the students a chance to take part in an array of cricket games and mix with students from other schools, within the beautiful setting of Polo Farm in Canterbury. The students were brilliant all day and got involved in all activities, highlighting table cricket as their favourite. The students received medals and certificates for their effort and participation on the day. Off the back of this Neptune class have been invited to a competitive event of table football to be hosted at Canterbury Cricket ground. The winning team will then go on to represent Kent at Lord's Cricket Ground London against teams from all over the country. It would be a great opportunity for all the students involved so we wish them all the luck.











## Saturn

Term 3 has been busy in Saturn class. In English we have been studying nonfiction texts, focusing on Shakespeare. We have investigated his life and even had a visit from 'Blue Sky' who performed 'A Midsummer Night's Dream' and conducted workshops. Students then planned and wrote a newspaper article about the visit. We have also reviewed books, films, and television programmes.

Maths lessons have focused on life skill tasks, from telling the time of an analogue clock and translating it to digital. Other areas of maths have included rounding decimals and linking this to money and percentage problems.

The class have been enthralled in their science lessons, where we have focused on genetics. We looked at Darwin's work on evolution and investigated genetic traits, such as, tongue rolling and hand spans.





During ASDAN students have honed their fine motor skills by creating diamond art coasters/pictures and assessing the processes of making it, in an instructional form.



The volunteering element of their DofE bronze award has been fulfilled at Monkton Nature Reserve. The class have sucessfully cleared the 'Lester Trail', trimmed the hedgerows amd designed a new map.



Reading continues to be a focus with every student reading a book or using myON every day. Passwords have been sent home for myON, TT Rockstars and Typesy to encourage reading, times tables and touch typing from home.

As part of the DofE, the students helped with some path maintenance work and some ground clearance.








THE DUKE OF EDINBURGH'S AWARD

Students have also had the opportunity to attend Thanet Inclusive Games held at Hartsdown Leisure Centre, this term was Boccia and New Age Kurling.







They then applied this knowledge to create their own work inspired by the artist Mondrian. Mondrian used primary colours when creating his work and bold black lines to frame it.






# The Art Gallery (GCSE)

Syd - Dunkirk 1940, Water colour inks on cartridge paper


